Congratulations! You successfully made it through Reformation 2009. In so doing you have experienced one of the Reformation Rallying Cries - *Ecclesia semper reformanda est* - The Church is always reforming!

You and I are living these words in a very real sense as we move through this transitional time. An ongoing and continual reforming. New opportunities - new beginnings - new relationships. Our community of faith is a dynamic and vibrant entity. We are always moving into an unfolding and emerging future.

Reformation provides a powerful opportunity for us as a congregation to “hit the reset button”. I know that the last few weeks have been difficult ones as the ELCA works through the decisions made at the last Churchwide Assembly. As with any difficult time, there is peril and opportunity.

The **peril** is that we become focused solely on ourselves. We circle the wagons and fall victim to a siege mentality. We shut-down and shut-out. Ministry withers and outreach declines. While this may feel good for the short-term, it is a recipe for long-term disaster.

The **opportunity** side of the equation is to focus even more intently on the covenant God makes with us in Baptism:

“To live among God’s faithful people,
to hear the word of God and share in the Lord’s supper,
to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed,
to serve all people, following the example of Jesus,
and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth.” (ELW Page 237).

As we begin our ministry together, I invite you, as a community of faith, to **RESET**. This is a new beginning to a new chapter. Let us recommit ourselves to the ministry which lies ahead. Always giving thanks to God who gives us a new birth through our baptism into Christ, we are free to focus less on self and more on neighbor. We are able to live with the ambiguity of not knowing exactly HOW the future will unfold - because we know WHO holds it.

Ecclesia semper reformanda est - the Church is always reforming. I am excited to be part of this unfolding future at St. Timothy. I look forward to the ministry which awaits us all.

The Litany from Vespers concludes with one of my favorite prayers. I commend it to you as we begin this journey: “O God, you have called your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.”

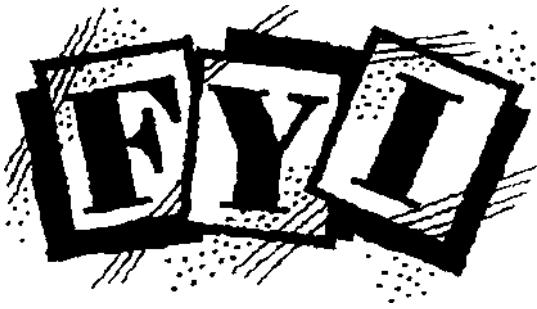

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

From the Director of Christian Education & Family Life

When the leaves start turning colors and the weather cools a bit I can't help but start thinking about twenty years ago, when I spent three weeks in late October through mid November in Dyersburg, Tennessee, enrolling employees in benefits at a large cotton fabric manufacturer. I was there in the smack-dab middle of the corn, cotton and soybean harvest. I had never seen any of the three as close up as I did during my stay in West Tennessee. I was obviously fascinated with the cotton, since I was working in a factory where they took raw cotton in one end of the plant and sent tons of cotton fabric out of the other, but I think I was more fascinated with the soybean harvest because it involved a crop-duster and I was in the process of earning my private pilot's license!

I would watch as the plane would fly about five feet above the long green rows, leaving a foggy mist in its trail, and then pull up into a steep, left 90 degree banking turn—knowing how hard it was to perfectly perform that in-flight maneuver—and then dive back down, leveling out at five feet again, to a spot just beside the rows the plane previously sprayed coming in the opposite direction. What I found out later was that the chemical sprayed on the soybeans was not some sort of pesticide or fertilizer, it was a defoliant. The purpose of the “crop dusting” was to get rid of the leafy growth before harvesting the bean pods. The leaves and foliage of the soybean plant are lush and plentiful and look really good. But that is not what a soybean plant is “about.” The farmer isn't after pretty *leaves*—the farmer is after the *fruit*!

There is a little gem of Martin Luther's called The Heidelberg Disputation. It seems Luther must have not had much other to do than write “theses” – the 95 of them that he tacked on the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, and 28 of them in this document! You can find it online at: <http://www.bookofconcord.org/heidelberg.php#19>. This short work contains some powerful comments from Luther (and scriptural references) on “works,” “free will,” and, very important to the Lutheran Christian view, “theology of the cross.” Some of the statements are found in our confirmation materials (in a simple form). Among them (the 25th thesis) is a statement in which Luther is explaining the difference between the “good works” we do of our own accord, and those we do because of our relationship with God through Jesus Christ: “Therefore man knows that works which he does by [faith of Jesus Christ] are not his but God's. For this reason he does not seek to become justified or glorified through them, but seeks God. His justification by faith in Christ is sufficient to him.”

I guess one could say “our works” are like the leaves on the soybeans—probably not entirely useless, in one sense of the word—but our works are not the fruit. I see so many good works that go on at St. Timothy Lutheran Church—works that bear much fruit in the life of our children, youth and families. It is evident they are not your works, but the works of Christ. Thank you for the good works you do—not to improve your standing with God, but to show Christ to your neighbor, your family, your family in faith at St. Timothy!
